I hope you enjoy reading this newsletter and wish you a peaceful and tranquil end of the year!

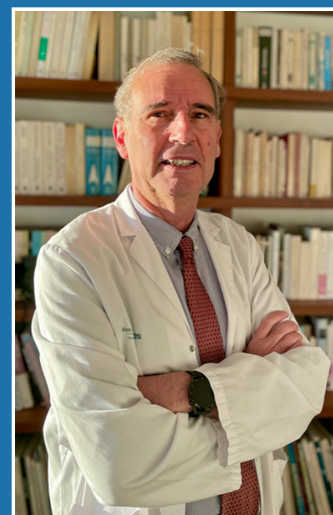
Presidential Letter by Professor Ignacio Sanpera

Dear Members and Friends,

A bit more than six months have passed since our successful meeting in Copenhagen, and our board has continued to work hard, attempting to make our next annual meeting in Krakow even more successful than our last one.

Last month we managed to have our first face-to-face board meeting since 2019. Everybody was full of energy and with plenty of proposals to keep improving our society, I will highlight some of the most relevant ones in the following sections.

As suggested by Hakan Omeroglu, our first vice president of the EPOS, we will be launching an initiative to recognize our forefathers and mentors of our society. To do this, we will name the meeting rooms at our Krakow annual meeting after the



first board members and founders of our society, in remembrance of them. A brief summary of their work will be found in the meeting program.

It gives me great pleasure to also announce that we have a new historian in our society, Prof Pierre Lascombes. Pierre is going to take over from Prof Klaus Parsch. First, I want to thank Klaus for his enthusiasm and not always-recognized work, and at the same time, welcome Pierre in this role, knowing that he will serve with the same enthusiasm that he has always shown in his previous work in our Society.

As some of you may know, during the last board meeting, a campaign was started to improve the communication and relationship between EPOS and the National Societies. With this action, EPOS was sponsoring the registration of a young member of a National Society, while the National Society was giving support for the traveling expenses. So far, we have had positive answers from Holland, Portugal, Spain, Switzerland, Italy and France. We hope that many more National Societies will join this initiative. Please, if your society is not already engaged, contact them and ask them to support the initiative.

From an education perspective, EPOS is still busy promoting both basic and advanced education in our field. We have carried on successfully with our [BAT-Trilogy courses in Vienna](#) and we have implemented a curriculum with [2-3 advanced courses](#) a year trying to cover the different aspects of our specialty. We are also willing to explore the possibility of partnering with National Societies to promote educational activities in our different member countries.

Also, to allow our young colleagues to get proper training in paediatric orthopaedics, we are proud to announce the launch of the EPOS Fellowship program (FEPOS). A program dedicated to giving basic training in paediatric orthopaedics to these young fellows, who have finished their orthopedic training and are willing to pursue a career in paediatric orthopaedics. The Fellowship consists of a one year-supervised paid position in an EPOS-recognized center. So far, the program is going to start with five Hospitals across Europe. More information will appear shortly.

Finally, just a few words to remind everyone, that during these days the Climate World Summit is taking place in Egypt. So far, the news announced does not seem very positive over the progress made in the world.

As part of our individual responsibility, our board is working on minimizing our carbon footprint. In our Krakow annual meeting, some changes are going to be implemented, such as the banning of paper programs and the classic bags and pens. Also, Badges are going to be printed with a QR code to download the programs. We will ask for you as participants to recycle your plastic bag tags.

Additionally, for those living in proximity to the venue (< 300-400 Km) we are working on securing some discounts by working in partnership with the Polish railway to encourage you to travel by train rather than by plane or private transport. We ask for your understanding and cooperation, and if you have other ideas that can help to decrease our carbon footprint, we are willing to hear from them.

On behalf of my board and myself, I want to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and hope to be able to greet all of you personally in our [next Annual Meeting in Krakow](#).

Report on FORTE Summer School



The 6th [FORTE Summer School](#) took place in Athens from the 25 to the 29 July 2022. Initiatives such as the European Educational Platform and the European Board of Orthopaedics and Traumatology ([EBOT](#)) Exam are essential to secure the standards of education.

FORTE Summer School aims to assist candidates in their preparation for the EBOT Exam or the National Board Exams by providing a high-quality general review based on the European Core Curriculum of Orthopaedics and Traumatology. Coordinated by the Scientific Committee of FORTE (Course Chair: Panayiotis Megaloikonomos, Greece), lectures and faculty were developed with the partnership of the European Federation of National Associations of Orthopaedics and Traumatology ([EFORT](#)) and of the European Subspecialty Societies.

EPOS faculty members were Nanni Allington, Federico Canavese, Catharina Chiari, Muharrem Inan and Dimitrios Metaxiotis. There were two parallel courses – a Comprehensive Review Course designed for all trainees and an Exam Preparation Course focusing on case discussion designed for advanced trainees.

The 114 participants from 19 different countries and 50 international speakers enjoyed the mediterranean atmosphere and the friendly environment for exchange of clinical experiences, case discussions and networking between participants and faculty.

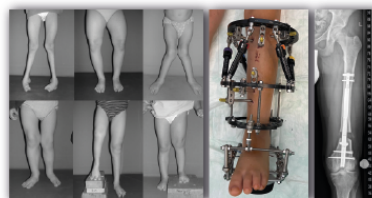
EPOS ADVANCED COURSE – LOWER LIMB DEFORMITY
